

In exercise of the powers conferred by Section 7 of the Delhi High Court Act, 1966 (Act 26 of 1966) read with article 225 of the Constitution of India, Clause 27 of Letters Patent and all other powers enabling it in this behalf, the High Court of Delhi, hereby makes the following amendments in the rules contained in Part-C of Chapter 2, Part (II) (Civil), Part F(b) of Chapter 4 and Part-C of Chapter 5 of the High Court Rules & Orders, Volume V, namely :-

1. In Rule 3 of Part C of Chapter 2 the words “three typed copies” occurring therein shall be substituted by the words “two typed, photostat or computerised copies”.
2. In Rule 1 of Part II of (Civil), Part F(b) of Chapter 4 the words “three copies” occurring therein shall be substituted by the words “two typed, photostat or computerised copies”.
3. The following shall be substituted for existing Sub-rule (1) of Rule 3, Part C of Chapter 5 :-

3(1) “The destruction of judicial records, books and papers including Court Fee Stamps affixed to documents which are to be destroyed, shall be effected by tearing either manually or through a shredding machine so as to render it unlikely that the documents as well as Court Fee Stamps affixed to documents so torn up may be used again by, or in the presence of, the supervising officer.”

Note :- These amendments shall come into force with immediate effect.
